In June we received some good news as a Church. Along with 15 other parishes in the Diocese of Birmingham we have been successful in our application for a Children and Family Missioner. This application was supported by the school and Carl and it is envisaged that the person will work closely with the school. It is hoped that the successful applicant will be starting in September on a part time or full time basis. The closing date is the 3rd July, if you know of anyone who might be interested. The appointment is initially for three years but we hope to find sufficient funds to make this a permanent appointment.

I am also pleased to announce that Mark Waterstreet having put himself forward for ordination has been successful. He will start 3 years of training in September. Assuming all goes to plan he will be ordained a Deacon in 2018 and Priest in 2019.

HS2 update: Ray and I have had a interesting month. We have been appointed to our borough-wide roles which are in addition to our Water Orton responsibilities. Ray is the lead councillor for Scrutiny, a process that oversees NWBC 's effectiveness, and I am the lead councillor for community safety and HS2, so we are both excellently placed to fully represent Water Orton's interests.

This is an important time with regards to HS2. John Warren and the Water Orton HS2 Action Group continue to fight hard representing our interests and as a community we need to do all we can to support the Action Group's efforts. Last week HS2 formally responded to the Select Committee's Interim Report which previously recognised that noise and HGV traffic were significant concerns for Water Orton. While the HS2 response did not make specific reference to Water Orton it did recognise that they had not previously consulted well enough about the impact of the Railhead on our area. This is important because the HGV construction traffic that will be driving through our village will be travelling to and from the Railhead. HS2 have formally committed to consider our local proposals to improve community engagement and this will hopefully help the Action Group further champion our interests which I will fully support as lead councillor for HS2.
